

# WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW **Good Neighbour Regulations**



The Township of North Kawartha supports a healthy community with a lifestyle and economy that sustains the natural environment and heritage. Everyone should be able to enjoy themselves without being negatively impacted by nuisance or disrespectful behaviour

### **Animal Control**

- · All pets must be on a leash or tethered and under the care of owners
- Do not let your pet roam onto other properties. Owners are required to pick up all pet waste

#### **Fireworks**

· Fireworks are ONLY permitted:

New Year's Eve — between 7:00 p.m. and 1:00 a.m. the following day;

Victoria Day, Canada Day, Civic Holiday and Labour Day— between 7:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. on the weekend preceding and including the statutory holiday;

- Fireworks at individual properties can generate unwanted noise and disturb pets and wildlife

- · Excessive noise disturbs your neighbours and carries over bodies of water
- Noises likely to disturb your neighbours are radios, animals, motor vehicles, lawn mowers, watercrafts, construction (demolition, repair and lighting restrictions)
- In the event you are creating noise that is disruptive to others you may be charged according to By-Law 2004-0017 (available on our website or call 705-656-4445 for more details)

# **Outdoor Fires**

- No daytime burning between 8 a.m. 6 p.m. from April 1 to October 31
- Burn permits are required by the property owner. Burn permits for property owners are free to obtain online at www.northkawartha.ca/burnpermit or by visiting the municipal office at 280 Burleigh Street, Apsley, ON K0L 1A0

- Flying lanterns are NOT permitted see By-Law 2018-0085
- · Fires must be supervised by an adult, never left unattended, and be fully extinguished

# **Parking**

- All parking should occur on your own property
- There is no parking on any township road or right of way (By-Law 2008-0050)

#### **Trespassing**

Respect property boundaries. Trespassing on private property is an offence Complaints are dealt with by the Ontario **Provincial Police** 





Curbside pickup Garbage in clear bags and recycling curbside pickup in available. The property owner should provide you with clear options for garbage and recycling. **Transfer Stations:** The property owner may provide you with a waste pass.

#### **Water Safety**

Be Water Smart – wear Personal Floatation Devices (PFDs) on ALL vessels Driving a boat while impaired is illegal – the same as for motor vehicles. Pleasure craft operators are required, by Transport Canada, to have a Pleasure Craft Operator Card

Watch your wake - generally boats should not exceed speeds of 10km/hour within 30m (100') of shoreline - to protect against shoreline erosion
