While only one Council position has changed, I must acknowledge the significance of this change. After nearly 20 years we finally have another woman on Council!

Ruthanne McIlmoyl may be new to Council as our Councillor at Large, but her roots run deep in our community and public service is in her DNA. I don't think it will take her long to find her Council groove, since she has attended almost every single Council meeting these past 3 years.

Colin McLellan is back for a second term as our Ward 2 Councillor and still has my former title as the youngest member of the team. Colin's input is always valuable and often comes from a different perspective or unique angle. The number of times I've said: 'Excellent question Colin!' or, 'Good point- I never thought of that...' are too many to count.

Jim O'Shea is back for his third term of Council as our Ward 1 Councillor. Jim has been an advocate for the Chandos community even before he was on Council, as he spent a number years serving as president of the Chandos Lake Association. Jim is passionate about our environment and is deeply committed to protecting our lakes and forests.

Jim Whelan's service to this community began in the 1990's and he has been one of our longest serving Reeve/Mayors. He was acclaimed for another term as our Deputy Mayor and I wouldn't be surprised if he's going for the longest serving Deputy Mayor title as well. Seriously though, Jim is my mentor. Our community has been through the wringer these past few years and I believe we've only become stronger and more resilient because of it. It's like I always say: 'We cannot stop challenges from arising but we can choose how we respond to them. If we face our challenges with the right attitude and the courage to look for solutions, we will find success.'

So once again I make this pledge to all of you:

With each and every issue that comes before us, this Mayor and this Council will do its 'homework'. We will listen to all community concerns. We will respectfully consider the advice of staff and experts. We will ask for guidance and help when needed.
