Thom Unrau, Director of Community Conservation, Kawartha Land Trust Kawartha Phragmites Management Area Lead

Mr. Unrau provided a slide presentation to inform Council of the economic, social and environmental impacts of phragmites, an invasive plant, and offered the opportunity for North Kawartha to be part of a joint application for funding. The goal is to control phragmites along roadsides and public lands and to monitor public lands. The Program supports existing efforts and allows for coordination across jurisdictions by forming phragmites groups. The application would include Peterborough County and Kawartha Lakes as convened by Kawartha Land Trust The grant is up to \$50,000 with a one-to-one matching. The estimated contribution from North Kawartha would be up to \$5,000.
